ENTRY RULES:

-Open classes are open to all exhibitors unless otherwise specified.

-All entries accepted on Monday, July 26, 2021 from 10 am until 2 pm.

-Judging will be conducted from 3 until 5 pm. Only authorized persons will be permitted in Exhibit Area while judges are working.

THE FAIR COMMITTEE IS NOT RESPONSIBLE FOR ANY ARTICLE EXHIBITED, BUT DUE CARE AND DILIGENCE WILL BE GIVEN TO ALL ENTRIES AT ALL TIMES

- The exhibitor will be given an entry tag for each article entered. The exhibitor should place this entry tag on the proper article in a manner that is not visible to judges while the item is being judged, and retain the stub of the tag to identify and reclaim article and any premiums due at the close of the Fair.

No premiums will be given without the claim stubs for the article.

- Exhibitors will not be allowed to remove articles until Thursday, July 29th from 9am-12pm.

-Will not be responsible for any items not picked up by 2pm on Thursday. Any unclaimed premiums will be forfeited.

-Each entry must be the exhibitor's own work.

-Exhibits must be work completed during the past year. *Textile Division*

Items must be work completed in the past two years.

-If there is more than one article in any exhibit, they should be fastened together securely or only one item may be exhibited.

-Each entry will be judged on its quality of work. Therefore, ribbons will be awarded on merit of entry.

-Any item can be disqualified at the judges' discretion.

-All canning items must be in standard canning jars.

-Rules for individual categories take precedence.

-The Fair will not act as a selling agent. No entry is to have a 'for sale' tag attached.

-The decisions of judges are final.

-LIMIT OF ONE ENTRY PER PERSON PER CLASS

JUDGING CRITERIA

Baked Goods *Appearance, texture, aroma.

Candies *Appearance, texture.

Canning *Appearance of pack, head space, preparation and selection of canned products. All items must be well sealed.

Sewing *Fabric, workmanship, general appearance.

Crafts *Design, color, workmanship, general appearance.

Produce *Freshness, maturity, color, proper size, uniformity.

Floral *Freshness, good foliage, insect free, plant and flowers grown by exhibitors, containers not judged, uniformity of arrangement.

-Entries will only be taken for categories listed in class listings.

PRIZES:

First, second, third and participant

ribbons will be awarded in each class. Sections with more than 5 entries will be awarded a champion ribbon. Up to (10) ten best in show ribbons will be awarded, providing there are (3) three or more champions in that division. The *divisions* are as follows: *Textiles, Culinary, Horticulture, Quilts, Photography, Arts/Crafts, Youth, Senior, and 4H.* There will also be some special ribbons awarded in addition to the class and division ribbons and awards. **Best of Show Ribbons and prizes for Best of Show are open to Casey County Residents ONLY.**

Sewing machine work is acceptable for embellishments, such as topstitching and buttonholes. Decorative items with creatively surged threads.

Knives, rotary tools, gouges, etc. Burned is marking the surface of a gourd by use of heat. Embellishment is any decorative item natural or artificial attached to the gourd for the purpose of improving the appearance of the work.
